MPD spoke about the following:

- Available from 8am to 7pm (for events like this)
- Summary of Officer's points:
 - If you have any questions or concerns in the neighborhood please contact them. They are working on more patrols especially since the uptick in vehicle entries.
- Highlights of Crime Stats:
 - YTD: So far we have zero homicides and violent sexual crimes, whereas carjackings and robberies are up (robberies have doubled from 5 to 10). We are relatively even on the rest of the crime (like burglaries and motor vehicle thefts).

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A note on technology: There have been reports of car thieves scanning from nearby for the signals from key fobs. If this is a worry to you, the Officer suggested using your car door key instead of the key fob.

- Q&A with MPD:
 - Question: What is the strategy to address carjacking? (1)Pay attention to your surroundings. If there are people making you uncomfortable, or it doesn't feel right, avoid it. (2)Keep an eye out at gas stations. (3)Don't stay in your car after parking it. (4)Don't pull too close to cars at traffic signals so that you cannot move forward or change lanes and drive away if needed.
 - Question: How far away does someone need to get a code from a key fob?
 15-100 feet away. Right now this is being used more for high end vehicles
 (Dodge Chargers, Lexus, Durangos, etc.)
